Tournament Overview

The biennial multi-sport ANOC World Beach Games will be held for the first time in San Diego, California, Oct 10-14, 2019 and will include Wakeboard and Water Ski Jump.

Nomination Process

A maximum of 2 athletes per National Olympic Committee (NOC) will be permitted to enter each medal discipline. The medal disciplines are Men's and Women's Wakeboard and Water Ski Jump.

The IWWF will select athletes to the Games. See IWWF selection criteria [here](#).

Athletes must be entered through their NOC.

As the recognized national sport association, WSWC has entered into arrangements with the Canadian Olympic Committee (COC) & IWWF to facilitate the coordination of athletes to this event. The final selection of the Canadian athletes who will participate in the Games will be made by the IWWF by July 15, 2019.

General Eligibility Requirements

To be eligible for nomination and selection to the team, athletes must be Canadian citizens who are members in good standing of WSWC; and must:

- (a) remain in good standing with WSWC through to the conclusion of the Games;
- (b) have a Canadian passport valid until April 14, 2020 (six months after the Games); and
- (c) sign, submit and comply with the COC Athlete Agreement
- (d) Be in compliance with all relevant IWWF, and Association of National Olympic Committees (ANOC) requirements for eligibility.
- (e) Each athlete nominated to represent Canada at the Games must sign a WSWC Event Participant's Contract agreeing to adhere to all WSWC rules and regulations, including WSWC's Code of Conduct. A copy of the Event Participant Contract is available from WSWC upon request.

Appeals

An athlete may appeal any decision made pursuant to this document. If both parties are in agreement, the WSWC Appeals Policy can be bypassed and the matter can be brought immediately before the Sport



Dispute Resolution Center of Canada who will then manage the appeals process. An appeal shall be made and dealt with in accordance with the most recent version of WSWC's Appeals Policy. A copy of the Appeals Policy is available from WSWC upon request and is posted on the WSWC's website at www.wswc.ca.

Code of Conduct

WSWC may, at any time, and at its discretion, disqualify an athlete from being considered for nomination to the Canadian Team or remove an athlete after selection based on current or past behavior of the athlete that is inconsistent with WSWC's Code of Conduct. A copy of the Code of Conduct is available from WSWC upon request. WSWC shall advise the affected athlete and the IWWF and COC, in writing, of its decision.

Competition Readiness

WSWC may, at any time, and at its discretion, disqualify an athlete from being considered for nomination to the Canadian Team or remove an athlete after selection if, due to illness, injury, lack of physical fitness or other reason that affects the athlete's ability to perform, WSWC believes it unlikely that the athlete will be able to perform at the event at a level consistent with the scores upon which the nomination of the athlete to the Team would be or was based. WSWC shall advise the affected athlete and the IWWF and COC of its decision by July 11, 2019. Any athlete removal after nomination to the COC is subject to the approval of the COC Team Selection Committee.

Support Staff Selection

Where budget permits, should WSWC chose to send support staff to accompany athletes to the Games, support staff (e.g. team leader, technical coach, sport medicine/psychology personnel) will be selected by WSWC. The support staff will be selected based on the principle of sending a team of specialists that is best capable of assisting athletes in achieving podium performances at the Games.

- NSF nominated team leaders must satisfy the expectations and requirements of the Canadian Olympic Committee's *Team Leader Position Description*.
- To be recognized as an official coach, he or she must be in good standing with the Professional Coaching Program of the Coaching Association of Canada as per the COC Coach Recognition Policy. The deadline for compliance with the Coaching Association of Canada requirement is aligned with the COC Team Nomination Deadline
